The book for June will be **American Dirt** by Jeanine Cummins. A 2020 bestseller, page-turner, and Oprah selection, the book is widely available (at \$4 to \$5 used). It personalizes the hazardous and demeaning human migration from Mexico to the US. Some Latinx writers have raised issues of cultural appropriation and felt that the publishing industry should invest in promoting their work on these issues with the same zeal. Reviews in general have been very favorable.

The book for **July** will be San Francisco's Salvadorian-American journalist Roberto Lovato's **Unforgetting**, **A Memoir of Family, Migration, Gangs, and Revolution in the Americas**, (Harper, 2020). We should discuss this choice in June and push it to August or September if the group would prefer lighter reading for July. Lovato's family has seen a huge slice of Central American history which has included gang violence and poverty. He moves back and forth in time between 1932 and 2015 and in place between El Salvador and Los Angeles giving us a complex view of US and Central American life. Reviews are favorable. Available in local libraries, or Amazon as print or ebook, and used at \$6-7.
